The other books in the series are *The Black Swan*, *Antifragile*, *Skin in the Game*, and *The Bed of Procrustes*. *Fooled by Randomness* is the word-of-mouth sensation that will change the way you think about business and the world. Such individuals attract devoted followers who believe in their guru's insights and methods. But no one can replicate what is obtained by chance. Are we capable of distinguishing the fortunate charlatan from the genuine visionary? Must we always try to uncover nonexistent messages in random events? It may be impossible to guard ourselves against the vagaries of the goddess Fortuna, but after reading *Fooled by Randomness* we can be a little better prepared. Travel and Home in Homer's Odyssey and Contemporary Literature brings Homer's Odyssey together with contemporary literary texts ranging from Rebecca West's *The Return of the Soldier* to Marilynne Robinson's *Housekeeping* and Cormac McCarthy's *The Road* to produce new readings that reframe, reorient, and ultimately revise aspects of Homer's iconic story of travel and home.
