This substantial and ambitious dictionary explores the languages and cultures of visual studies. It provides the basis for understanding the foundations and motivations of current theoretical and academic discourse, as well as the different forms of visual culture that have come to organize everyday life. The book is firmly placed in the context of the 'visual turn' in contemporary thought. It has been designed as an interdisciplinary or transdisciplinary introduction to the vocabularies and grammars of visuality that inform thinking in the arts and humanities today. It also offers insight into the philosophical frameworks which underpin the field of visual culture. In addition the author's introduction provides a comprehensive and critical introduction which documents the significance of the visual turn in contemporary theory and culture. It is accompanied by an extensive bibliography and further reading list. As both a substantive academic contribution to this growing field and a useful reference tool, this book offers a theoretical introduction to the many languages of visual discourse. It will be essential reading for graduate students and scholars in visual studies, the sociology of visual culture, cultural and media studies, philosophy, art history and theory, design, film and communication studies.

Le cours Concepts fondamentaux de la philosophie antique a été professé par Martin Heidegger à l'Université de Marbourg pendant le semestre d'été 1926, alors que le philosophe travaillait à l'achèvement d'Etre et Temps. Il vient après le cours sur les Concepts fondamentaux de la philosophie aristotélicienne, du semestre d'été 1924, et sir le Sophiste de Matou du semestre d'hiver 1924-1925, et constitue un document capital pour cerner l'interprétation heideggerienne de la pensée antique à l'époque de l'ontologie fondamentale. Heidegger nous fait assister ici en fin de compte à la genèse de la philosophie elle-même, c'est-à-dire à cette pensée radicalement critique qui scinde et différencie l'être de l'étant et qui s'est développée en Grèce à travers une succession de figures majeures qui vont de Thalès à Aristote, " sommet de la philosophie antique ".
